Christ is coming

“Christ coming” presents you a dilemma; there are two Christs coming...”instead of Christ” and Jesus Christ. Choosing Jesus requires you to know them both.

“Instead of Christ” comes first to convince you that he is Jesus. Luke 17:34 KJV tells that two are in bed when he arrives: “I tell you, in the night there shall be two men in one bed; the one shall be taken, and the other shall be left.”

Asleep and not awake is a bad idea as Mark 13:37 KJV

instructs you to “watch”; neither Luke nor Mark wants you taken first.

“And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch.”



In addition to finding you sleeping when he arrives, “instead of Christ” expects you to be working for him; “Anticipating rapture” is working for him. Thinking “rapture” sets the stage for Satan to harvest Christians. Matthew 24:40-41

KJV shows this harvest: [40] Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

[41] Two women shall be grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

Recognizing Satan’s rapture bolts you into action.

Researching your King James Bible shows the word “rapture” cannot be found and a review in the manuscripts explains why: You cannot translate a word that is not

there. “Two Christs” are coming is a truth that “rapture” conceals as Matthew 4:23-26 KJV begins to tell you about the first one, the “instead of Christ”:

[23] Then, if any man shall say unto you, Lo, here is Christ, or there; believe it not.

[24] For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect.

[25] Behold, I have told you before.

[26] Wherefore if they shall say unto you, Behold, he is in the desert; go not forth; behold, he is in the secret chambers, believe it not.”

You “believe it not” because the “instead of Christ” comes first. Rev 12:9 KJV shows that by coming first, Satan deceives the whole world:

“And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world: he is cast out into the earth, and his angels were cast out with him.”

It is true that God sends both Christs and Luke 21:21-22 KJV connects “instead of Christ” to the “days of vengeance”; he also discusses coping with him:

[21] Then let them which are in Judaea flee to the mountains; and let them which are in the midst of it depart out; and let not them that are in the countries enter thereinto.

[22] For these be the days of vengeance, that all things which are written may be fulfilled.”

“Flee to the mountains” instructs you to avoid the “instead of Christ” and Luke 21:23 KJV uses metaphors to explain why:

“But woe unto them that are with child, and to them that give suck, in those days! For there shall be great distress in the land, and wrath upon this people.”

Thinking metaphorically and spiritually, Christ is your bridegroom. He has been gone for a long time and He expects a virgin when He returns; He expects you waiting.

Both male and female must remain faithful. “Woe unto them that are with child” illustrates you losing your spiritual virginity to the “instead of Christ”; you did not wait! “To them that give suck, in those days” shows you nursing a suckling; it shows you nursing Satan’s work along.

Without using metaphors, Luke 21:27 KJV reveals the coming of Christ; the true Christ has arrived:

“And then shall they see the Son of man coming in the cloud with power and great glory.”

Patience is rewarded as you see yourself sharing God’s power and great glory...with the bridegroom!

Are you prepared for Christ?
